

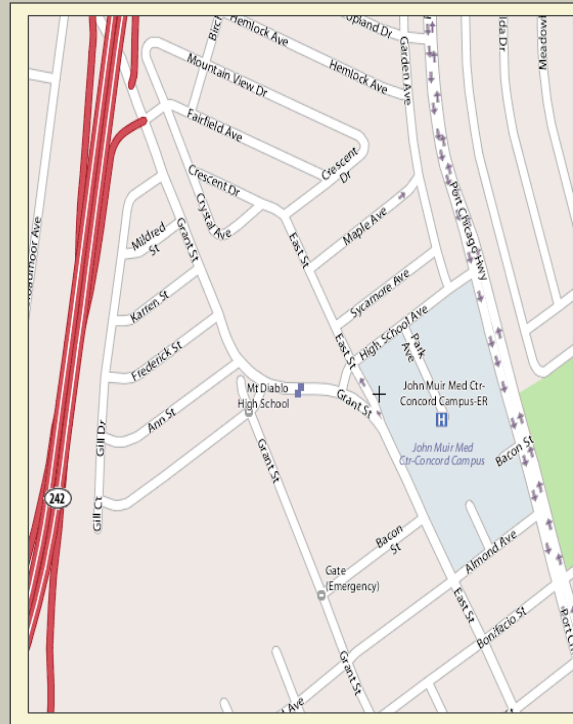

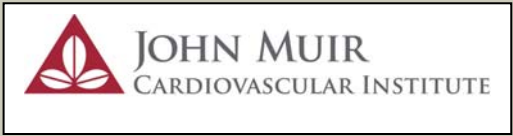

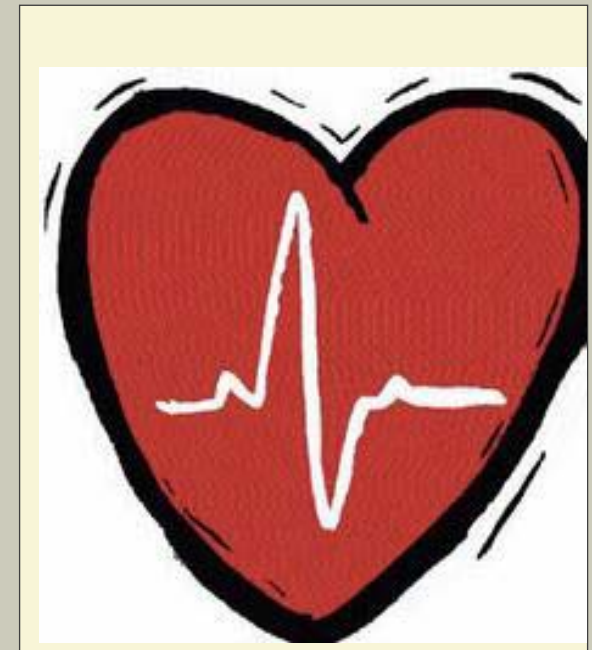

Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, each participant will be able to:

- Identify sinus rhythm, atrial pacing, and extrastimulus testing, and ventricular pacing and extrastimulus testing in an electrophysiologic study
- Discuss techniques used during EP testing for supraventricular rhythm studies
- List findings which lead to the diagnosis of supraventricular rhythms during the EP study
- State techniques used with atrial flutter and atrial fibrillation studies
- Be familiar with the diagnostic features and sub-types of ventricular tachycardia
- Identify the high risk disorders and indications for ICD implantation
